

# PROPOSED ABERDEENSHIRE LOCAL DEVELOPMENT PLAN 2020

### RESPONSE FORM

As part of the production of the Local Development Plan, a 'Main Issues Report' was published in January 2019. The responses from these consultations have helped to inform the content of the Proposed Local Development Plan ("the Proposed Plan").

The Aberdeenshire Local Development Plan will direct decision-making on land-use planning issues and planning applications in Aberdeenshire for the 10-year period from 2021 to 2031. The Proposed Plan was agreed by Aberdeenshire Council in March 2020 as the settled view of the Council. However, the Proposed Plan will be subjected to an independent examination and is now open for public comment.

This is your opportunity to tell us if anything should be changed in the Proposed Plan, and why.

When writing a response to the Proposed Plan it is important to specifically state the modification(s) that you would wish to see to the Plan.


This is the only remaining opportunity to comment on the Proposed Plan. The reasons for any requested changes will be analysed and reported to Scottish Ministers. They will then appoint a person known as a Reporter to conduct a public examination of the Proposed Plan, focusing particularly on any unresolved issues and the changes sought.

Ministers expect representations (or responses) to be concise (no more than 2000 words) and accompanied by limited supporting documents. It is important to ensure that all of the information that you wish to be considered is submitted during this consultation period as there is no further opportunity to provide information, unless specifically asked.

Also, the beer garden of The Stead Inn has benefited from an open view across the countryside. Extra trees might compensate for the loss of open country.		
If a new village hall is incorporated onto the Potterton site, would it be large enough for the "round the stick" indoor bowling which has been pushed out of the old community centre due to the extra nursery school hours?		
With regard to future long-term plans:		
We have a couple of archaeological remains (i.e., the cairn + the temple stones) which would need to be protected for historical reasons. (Somewhere there may also be traces of a medical chapel).		
Also we have badger setts near the lane which runs from Milton of Potterton up to the main Aberdeen to Tarves road. Other wildlife is plentiful.
