

PROPOSED ABERDEENSHIRE LOCAL DEVELOPMENT PLAN 2020 RESPONSE FORM

As part of the production of the Local Development Plan, a 'Main Issues Report' was published in January 2019. The responses from these consultations have helped to inform the content of the Proposed Local Development Plan ("the Proposed Plan").

The Aberdeenshire Local Development Plan will direct decision-making on land-use planning issues and planning applications in Aberdeenshire for the 10-year period from 2021 to 2031. The Proposed Plan was agreed by Aberdeenshire Council in March 2020 as the settled view of the Council. However, the Proposed Plan will be subjected to an independent examination and is now open for public comment.

This is your opportunity to tell us if anything should be changed in the Proposed Plan, and why.

When writing a response to the Proposed Plan it is important to specifically state the modification(s) that you would wish to see to the Plan.

This is the only remaining opportunity to comment on the Proposed Plan. The reasons for any requested changes will be analysed and reported to Scottish Ministers. They will then appoint a person known as a Reporter to conduct a public examination of the Proposed Plan, focusing particularly on any unresolved issues and the changes sought.

Ministers expect representations (or responses) to be concise (no more than 2000 words) and accompanied by limited supporting documents. It is important to ensure that all of the information that you wish to be considered is submitted during this consultation period as there is no further opportunity to provide information, unless specifically asked.

Modification that you wish to see (please make specific reference to the section of the Proposed Plan you wish to see modified if possible, for example Section 9, paragraph E1.1):

The sections relating to Potterton, primarily OP1 & OP2; but my remarks are also pertinent to the reserved areas FR037a & FR104 and should be treated accordingly. My concerns relate to the consultative case for developing the green belt; infrastructure and amenities with regards to sewage, roads and schooling; and aesthetics.

Reason for change:

1. Consultative case for developing the green belt in and around Potterton. Quite frankly this case has not been adequately made. Potterton is currently a commuter village. The current plan does not promote the integration of employment and housing in the context of an economic depression perpetuated by the current Covid crisis that will be continued by a hard Brexit. The focus is clearly on expanded housing provision with no meaningful consideration given to the actual demand for housing. At the behest of corporate house builders, Potterton will be transformed into a commuter town not a centre of sustainable development. This appears little more than [REDACTED] to exploit the Aberdeen Western Peripheral Route by turning green field sites into housing plots.
2. Infrastructure and amenities.
 - 2.1 Sewage and water supply. Currently we do not have the infrastructure to support the proposed partial developments, which are to be sited on land with suspect water tables and liable to flooding; a danger that seems to be becoming more pronounced with the current extremes of weather conditions in the north-east of Scotland. Who will bear the cost of these necessary enhancements – the corporate housing developer or the taxpayer?
 - 2.2 Roads. The proposal that construction will take up to five years will severely impact on local access to AWPR at the Blackdog roundabout. Resultant congestion in the village will again raise environmental issues with regards to pollutants, excessive noise and increased risk of road accidents. There is no clear plan to build at least a 'B' grade road to skirt the construction site and provide ready access for villagers to AWPR at the Blackdog roundabout. Transport alternatives are limited, especially as the construction site will impact on the current 291 bus route; a service which is currently far short of adequate.
 - 2.3 Schooling. An increased housing capacity will require the building of a new primary school in Potterton as the projected intake is beyond the capacity of the Balmedie school. Where is this new school to be built and again, who will bear the cost, the corporate housing developers or the taxpayers?.

3. Aesthetics. The proposed corporate housing developer [REDACTED] does not have a high reputation for design quality with a tendency to pack rather than space dwellings throughout Aberdeenshire. No meaningful consideration seems to have been given to sustainable location and design on the proposed sites. No effort appears to have been made by the corporate housing developer to consult locally on these issues which should not be excused under cover of Covid. Again is the intention here to turn Potterton into the coastal equivalent of Westhills with [REDACTED] provided to order without any account taken of local conditions (including wishes for privacy) and vernacular traditions? No consideration has apparently been given to the creation of allotments for householders on the green belt around Potterton, nor to the creation of cycle paths, walking routes or tracks for horse. Indeed, there is little or no awareness in the Local Development Plan of the existing green belt between Aberdeen and Potterton as a green lung for the wider community from Blackdog to Ellon. A further indicator of the lack of imagination in planning proposals is the total lack of consideration for self-build ecological housing which will assuredly be of higher aesthetic and sustainable standards than the [REDACTED] corporate housing developer.
