

RESPONSE FORM

As part of the production of the Local Development Plan, a 'Main Issues Report' was published in January 2019. The responses from these consultations have helped to inform the content of the Proposed Local Development Plan ("the Proposed Plan").

The Aberdeenshire Local Development Plan will direct decision-making on land-use planning issues and planning applications in Aberdeenshire for the 10-year period from 2021 to 2031. The Proposed Plan was agreed by Aberdeenshire Council in March 2020 as the settled view of the Council. However, the Proposed Plan will be subjected to an independent examination and is now open for public comment.

This is your opportunity to tell us if anything should be changed in the Proposed Plan, and why.

When writing a response to the Proposed Plan it is important to specifically state the modification(s) that you would wish to see to the Plan.

This is the only remaining opportunity to comment on the Proposed Plan. The reasons for any requested changes will be analysed and reported to Scottish Ministers. They will then appoint a person known as a Reporter to conduct a public examination of the Proposed Plan, focusing particularly on any unresolved issues and the changes sought.

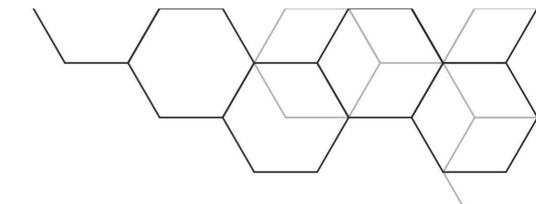
Ministers expect representations (or responses) to be concise (no more than 2000 words) and accompanied by limited supporting documents. It is important to ensure that all of the information that you wish to be considered is submitted during this consultation period as there is no further opportunity to provide information, unless specifically asked.



YOUR COMMENTS

Modification that you wish to see (please make specific reference to the section of the Proposed Plan you wish to see modified if possible, for example Section 9, paragraph E1.1):

Allocation of Sites MR038 and MR039, Banchory in the Aberdeenshire LDP 2020 (Proposed Plan). Sites previously preferred by Officers for 100 units (MR038) and Reserved for 100 units (MR039)

Reason for change:

Sites MR038 and MR039 were both included within the LDP 2021 Main Issues Report ("the MIR"), with MR038 preferred for allocation with an indicative capacity of 100 units and MR039 Reserved with an indicative capacity also of 100 units (200 in total).

Bancon responded to the consultation following the MIR supporting that allocation and reservation. At that time, we noted that Banchory is a key settlement within the identified Local Growth and Diversification part of the Aberdeen housing market area (AHMA). It continued to sustain a good level of housing completions throughout challenging market conditions in the previous decade and as a location of choice for homeowners, should continue to be supported.

We also identified that ongoing growth in the Lochside of Leys area of Banchory is logical given the infrastructure investment in this northern part of the town, relating to the delivery of schools, leisure facilities, retail and business uses and enhancements to the natural environment. All this on land owned or controlled by the Burnett family, on whose land MR038 and MR039 are sited.

The Officers' report to the Marr Area Committee on 17 Sep 2019 carried forward the above prospective statuses. However, a comment was made at that Committee raising concerns about the biodiversity impact, the need to protect local woodland and concerns regarding drainage issues within the site. The call was for MR038 to be removed from the LDP, and this was carried by members at that Committee and also carried forward at the subsequent Infrastructure Services Committee.

This representation at Committee contradicted the Officers' recommendation, and raised unfounded concerns. MR038 lies outwith the boundary of the Local Nature Reserve (LNR) and does not impact any otherwise protected woodland. Para 196 of the adopted Scottish Planning Policy 2014 (SPP) states specifically that "buffer zones should not be established around areas designated for their natural heritage importance."

As such there is absolutely no policy justification for the removal of this site, which would provide ongoing certainty of delivery in an area which has benefited from high infrastructure investment.

A Drainage Impact Assessment supported the revised masterplan for Lochside of Leys, which highlighted no issues to development of sites across the area. This would be supported at a detailed site-level by technical reports demonstrating the strategy and local network capacity. The masterplan noted that the drainage strategy across the area was based on the collection of surface water runoff into detention basins, which would then discharge into filter trenches reflecting as close to existing drainage impacts as possible. The schematic below illustrates the strategy.




Fig 11 - Watercourses and current foul drainage

The removal of this site is especially unjustified with the advent of a longer lifecycle for LDPs, and the need to ensure that there is sufficient land allocation over potentially a 10-year period. Existing allocations within Lochside of Leys are expected to be complete within that time.

The designation proposed for MR039 in the MIR was welcomed for this reason too, providing a secondary tier of sites which could be brought forward in the event existing and new allocations are worked through prior to adoption of a new LDP, providing longer-term clarity for the local authority and developers alike.

In terms of housing land allocations, despite the position taken in the Proposed Plan (Appendix 6 Housing Land Allocations) we contend that there remains a housing land shortfall within the Aberdeen Housing Market Area (HMA). A surplus of 80 units is identified in the LDP in response to the SDP Housing Supply Allowance.

However, Homes for Scotland, analyse the housing land supply within the Aberdeen HMA as being short by c.483 units (a difference of 563 units where sites are considered to be constrained or non-effective). Worryingly, there are a number of sites where the bid or previous allocation has been increased by Aberdeenshire Council (in total 287 units) including some sites where this is seemingly without request, where there is no evidence of housebuilder involvement or the site is not evidently in effective ownership.

802 units within Aberdeenshire Council's analysis of housing land supply are from sites of 50 units or below. It is contended therefore that there is significant risk of a housing land shortfall as measured against the SDP Allowance, and this site would be effective in meeting that shortfall.

The Officers' response to the ISC was that "the site represents a significant proportion of all the new allocations being made in this area. While less of an issue than the removal of sites in Portlethen, the relatively small additions made elsewhere to the Aberdeen HMA housing allowances may not be able to cope with this loss. The site may need to be introduced should housing land supply in the Aberdeen HMA fall below the SDP requirement". We would argue on the basis of the above analysis that there is sufficient evidence that the allocated housing land falls below the SDP Housing Supply Allowance necessitating, by the Officers' own response, that this site should be reintroduced.

In addition, whilst not lying within the same area of Aberdeenshire but nonetheless in the Aberdeen Housing Market Area (AHMA), representations have been made previously by Bancon Homes regarding the continued under-delivery of housing at Chapeltown of Elsick. We do not object to the principle of this allocation, but continue to request that Aberdeenshire Council recognise (1) the significant proportion of the effective land supply within the AHMA that Chapeltown constitutes and (2) the number of completions arising from Chapeltown continues to be well below those envisaged in either the 2012 or 2017 LDP's.

In terms of the first point above, Appendix 6 of the Proposed Plan identifies a total housing land supply for the Aberdeen to Laurencekirk SGA of 6,030 homes. Chapeltown is allocated for a total of 4,045 homes, with only 164 delivered as of Jan 2019 (Housing Land Audit 2019). This leaves 3,881 homes remaining, constituting 64% of the total effective housing land supply for this SGA.

In relation to the second point, the delivery of 164 units since commencement in 2015 equates to a build rate of approx. 40 units per annum. Extrapolating this out, even at a more generous 60-80 units per annum, would leave a completion total of only 1,184 units by 2031. This would leave 2,861 units undelivered during the plan period.

This further throws into focus the risks associated with Aberdeenshire Council's assessment of effective land supply, and that without further allocations, the delivery of homes across the AHMA will be well below that required by current and prospective residents.

Taking all the above into account, we contend that MR038 should be reinstated (in line with the original Officers' recommendation to the local area Committee) and also that MR039 should be reinstated as either an allocation or as "Reserved" in the adopted LDP 2021.
